FV And I said "This is private property" and I said "You can't come in here and go up there and talk to anybody you want to."

LT Right.

FV And I said... He said "Well I wasn't here back then. I said "Well I was."

LT Mmm Hmm.

FV I said "You all have done nothing but cut us all down. He said "Well I just... I'm going to go up there and talk to him." I said "No, your not. This is a private rest... Ho... This is a private uh...

LT Residence.

FV Uh huh... Retirement club, and I said "You're not going up there."

LT Mmm Hmm. Well Good.

FV And he said "Well, I guess you know this isn't over." I said "As far as I'm con... It's over... Con... As far as I'm concerned, it's over for today."

LT Mmm Hmm.

FV "So don't come back today."

LT Mmm Hmm.

FV I called Barbara because your line was busy. Barbara said just call the police.

LT Yea, that will be fine... And ah... Let's see... If you could change my phone number down there... I've got this other line back out here now, and the 322... Yea... 3279

FV Okay. Okay... And if I can't reach you on that other number try on your beeper number?

LT Ah... Well probably the one to try me on first is 322-3279. I think you can take down the 767-5949.

FV I've got it (Inaudible)

MV Mmm Hmm. So they were just coming up uninvited to see Whitlinger?

FV Yea. He was fixing to get on the elevator and he just walked through the door. He was just... I heard him tell somebody he was from Channel 6. I thought "Oh my God".

LT Right.

FV (Inaudible) went out there and told him he couldn't go up there.

LT Right.

FV Interview (Inaudible). I reminded him of what they did to us.

LT Yea!

FV I said "Ya'll told everybody on the TV that we didn't have any air conditioning, which we didn't...

LT He said didn't have any for two months.

FV The (Inaudible)...

LT They said... Adel Lewis (SP) said... Your talking about two summers ago?

FV Yea.

LT Yea, Adel Lewis had said that we had been without air conditioning for two months, which was substantially incorrect. The building was always...

FV (Inaudible) and I told him... I said "Look what you..." (Inaudible - talking to someone in the background)... But anyway, I reminded him... You know, of all that crap and he said " Well, I wasn't here then." I said "I don't matter to me whether you did or you wasn't.

LT That's right.

FV And I said "Ya'll done enough damage to us then." I said "You will not go upstairs and interview anybody because this is a private owned rest home...

LT Right.

FV Retirement (Inaudible).

LT Right.

FV And I said "I'll tell you right now..." And he said "You know this isn't over with." I said "It is for me."

LT (Laughing).

FV Today it is.

LT Well, I'm glad you mentioned that. Yea, just... You know, that was a threat, I guess from him to intimidate to... So, I don't know... I talk...

FV I told him "If you have any more questions, call Larry Tompkins."

LT                    Yea. I talked to this Hoit (SP) about 20 minutes till five... Just right about five o'clock yesterday. Mamo and I were out for a drive and ah... This Hoit Hill (SP) with Channel 6 called. I didn't see the message till a little before six, and uh... I had another call from uh... Mary Keller's (SP) daughter-in-law that I... You know... Thought was more important than calling this Hoit Hill, who I knew was just looking for gossip. They're not really that interested in Clampitt or us, or the misery or well-being of any of the residents. They are just after gossip.

FV                    (Inaudible)

MV                    I thought it was there. I thought they had a key to that downstairs telephone room. I thought

FV                    Do what?

MV                    D... Downstairs telephone room she is looking for?

FV                    Yea, she wanted to get into the office (Inaudible)...

LT                    I thought that was on that... I... It... There's one down their somewhere.

FV                    Well, I gave her the keys right here and it wasn't on those...  
(Inaudible)

LT                    Oh, she can't...

FV                    I have no idea where it's at.

LT I don't know where it is... Ah...

FV (Inaudible)

LT Well... Let's see.

FV ... Call you?

LT Ah... Not yet. Have you told him I need to talk to him?

FV (Inaudible)

LT (Inaudible)... Well tell him I'm going to have him move out if he doesn't call me soon. I have asked for tw... He is... He is very negligent about getting in touch with me.

FV (Inaudible)

LT Huh?

FV He just got up a little while ago...

LT Well... You know... Do you need to get that other line?

FV (Inaudible)

LT Okay.

FV Do you want to hold?

LT Please. (Approximately a 30 second pause)

FV Oh, it's somebody wanting somebody.

LT Well... You did g... Very well on the Channel Six thing... You handled it well. They are abusive, pushy... Uh...

FV They don't have no for them to come in here and go upstairs...

LT ... Thuggy individuals... Yea, they work for a big corporation here in town who is wealthy, and a...

FV This is a private place.

LT Exactly. Exactly. It is certainly...

FV You have to ask permission (Inaudible)...

LT Right. Uh... And especially since John didn't invite him... You know...

FV (Inaudible)... Just out there... He had finished eating dinner when he was waiting to get on the elevator to go up. John went on up.

LT Yea... Well, did the guy come asking for John Whitlinger?

FV No, he just walked in and he started talking to John.

LT Oh, is that right?

FV Yea.

LT Ahhh...

FV So that's what aggravated me. (Inaudible)...

LT Well, I'd say they slandered us yesterday. I've got a lawsuit against them renewed. They've done it a second time, so that would extend what was done the first time, and it's a continuation...

LT Last night at six o'clock. But they didn't have it on at ten o'clock. I called that Hoit Hill, and I've got it recorded. I use my truth and fairness machine, you know my machine don't you? I've recorded it and I've made a copy of it, so I've got two on different hard drives, so... I like to docu... I like to be honest and truthful...

LT Oh, probably not.

FV (Inaudible)... I just told him...Six, that we was... That we didn't have any air conditioners and wouldn't even try to replace them. I said that was a "damn lie because we were working on them all the time."

LT And the building never was completely without air. The residential... We always had at least... I think, Ah... One of the com... Upstair compressors on. That left part of...

FV I just told him... "I said if you want to interview anybody or talk to anybody...

LT Yea...

FV (Inaudible)... Larry...

LT Well that's fine... That's good.

FV (Inaudible).

LT And that's... Yea...

FV Because I don't have the right to let you go up there.

LT Well that's good. You did good.

FV This is a private place.

LT That's right. You did good.

FV (Inaudible)...

LT Ah, well... He... They... Everybody down there is going to get relocated just fine.

FV Oh yea...

LT The facts of the...

FV Channel 6 has no (Inaudible)...

LT They are just abusive. They're just abusive.

FV (Inaudible).

LT They are a lot like Channel 3. They... And they are a big corporation... Yea, they... A...

FV (Inaudible)...

LT Well, that may be true. But I guess I have seen Channel 3 do similar things to other people... Ah... Just on issues they thought were relevant.

FV (Inaudible) Channel 3 come up here I'd tell them the same thing.

LT Exactly. Well, I think you are right. It's a private residence... You know... If someone's invited them up, that's one thing. But, if they are just coming in... Ah...

FV Walk through the front door...(Inaudible)... Finally, I asked him...

LT Well, just get their name. Just right their name. If anybody else comes down, right the name.

FV (Inaudible).

LT Yea, just right the name down.

FV Well, he was young.

LT I understand.

FV He said he hadn't worked their very long.

LT Well, it's just one of their...

FV (Inaudible).

LT Young bucks sent out to gather some gossip information. Mamo, do you need anything (Inaudible)... Anyway... Well you done good.

FV I just thought I'd let you know.

LT You did very good, and that 322-3279 number

FV Uh Huh...

LT The one similar to Clampitt...

FV Yea...

LT That one ought to be open most of the time, so you can... Both numbers are out here now, and I'll probably... So, the 322-3279... You crossed out the other one?

HH News Channel 6

LT Is Hoit Hill available?

HH Yes, this

LT My name is Larry Tompkins with Clampitt Apartments... You had called and left a message.

HH Yes sir. We had heard that you guys... Ah... I guess... The apartments were closing. Is that correct.

LT Yes. We have finally fallen victim to a couple of factors that just were too large to overcome.

HH Really. What does that mean?

LT Ah... Well... The Corporation had a wrongful, horrible, abusive judgment that was rendered against it about ah... Three years ago. Ah... In the neighborhood of \$400,000.00.

HH Wow!

LT Ah... The... This was about a year and a half after Judge Pavlick(SP) took office, and she was still pandering substantially... Ah... To at least one lawyer.

HH Mmm Hmm.

LT Ah... And I happened to have that lawyer and a former employer of

Clampitt sued currently, because I was sued involving the same claim.

HH What kind of... What was the nature of the claim?

LT Oh... A former employee had originally whined that she had not been paid for a few hours, and she had worked at the place for 5 years, and I had the manager at the time, get with the person, find out how many hours they were talking about, what kind of dollars... And I think it was like a \$700.00 amount.

HH Mmm Hmm.

LT And ah... As a prudent business decision, I authorized the payment of that, even though I felt like our records were correct, and the woman had not been mistreated, and she had been paid fairly. As a matter of fact, I even had on the check stubs at that time, stamp on the back that said "Signature and endorsement of this check is verification of hours worked and rate of hours paid." But, ah... The... Ah... Ah... I was sued, along with the corporation, and my mother, who was a stock holder in a corporation that owned the corporation. She should have been protected by two corporate shields. We were sued for seven years. It took seven years... This attorney by the name of Holley Crampton (SP), took seven years to get the thing to trial. She did no discovery. I am talking none. No depositions, no interrogatories, and no requests for admissions. None in seven years, and had sued... Had my mother and I sit in court for eight days and

gave her full side of the case, and rested, and only as I stood up as a Pro Se lawyer to ask Judge Pavlick for some assistance in subpoenaing a witness who could testify to the actual facts, Holley Crampton stands up and say's "Oh, by the way your Honor..." As if it is an afterthought... "My client and I have decided we need to drop two of the three parties we sued." And out of that, I sued them for malicious prosecution and have a live suit going, but the jury not being a jury of Clampitt's peers... Ah... Ah... And the fact that judges just let cases... Pavlick shouldn't have let this case be heard. It was a frivolous case, but the jury looked at ah... A small whine... Like I said, this employee had whined that she hadn't been paid a few hours, and after Crampton got involved, the Corporation and me and my mother... Three parties, were sued for 15 years worth of liability, and in Crampton's mind, she thought not only was Clampitt responsible for owing this woman for some back pay for the entire five year period, that we, by some federal law, she thought, became responsible for the prior ten years. So, she sued for a 15 year claim, and three times more parties than should have been sued, and had them sued for seven years. And even after... You know... Proving she was 66 % incorrect on her first claim as to who should have been sued, and it took her eight days of trial, where she... I guess did... Maybe that's where she did her discovery, instead of like they are supposed to do at the first, but this jury decided that... In order to

defeat the 10 year's prior claim, we provided a copy of our Franchise Tax, which proved we were a smaller corporation than this Federal Limit, and we didn't have enough sales. But, in doing so, we put that on record, to where a blue collar jury looks at a several hundred thousand dollar book value on a corporation, and thinks... Well, we can give several hundred thousand. You know book value and market value are substantially different things. But they ended up awarding this woman \$400,000.00...

HH \$400,000.00. I tell you what Mr. Tompkins, I...

LT They claimed she was held like a slave. Now, how could a woman be held like a slave? We just announced and no one know it within the apartment... Ah... We just announced... Oh, like yesterday, after we found out we were going to have to make some things... We announced we were closed. Now, we even get a call from the newspaper... I mean the TV station. You see what I am saying... The absurdness of that claim, and what re... You know... What really happens in reality, but ah... Clampitt has fallen victim to an absurd and negligent judge... Called judicial moronism, and an abusive, negligent lawyer enhancing a claim... Ah... Ah... An incorrect claim that a former employee made. So, I don't know. I don't know if si... I don't know if \$400,000.00 would put a dent in your bank account or not, or even Channel 6. I bet you as powerful and huge as they are, \$400,000.00 would put a crunch on that... Ah...

HH (Inaudible)... I tell (Inaudible)...

LT The second thing that... Major thing that ah... Put Clampitt out of business, and the ah... Elderly residents having to s... Ah... Find a new place...

HH Mmm Hmm.

LT Is some slander that occurred by a woman by the name of Adel Lewis. She used to work for you all didn't she?

HH Ah... Adel Lewis?

LT Mmm Hmm.

HH I think I remember ah... Yea...

LT Yes.

HH I think (Inaudible).

LT Yea, she slanderously and unfairly reported on some air conditioning problems we had a couple of years ago.

HH Oh really?

LT Yea. She reported that we hadn't had an air conditioning for two months in the middle of summer. She came there like two and three days...

HH How did that... How did that lead to you all going out of business?

LT Well, it cost us \$60,000.00 in revenues from lost business... Ah... Your station's abusive, incorrect, false reporting...

HH Did you... Did you file suit or anything?

LT Not y... No. But, the manager at the time, went out there personally

afterwards to ah... Ah... Try to get some satisfaction with your station manager about the abusive, irresponsible, slanderous activity... Ah... Ah... You all slandered me again tonight.

HH Oh, did we?

LT Yes... Ah...

HH How's that?

LT Well... Talked about a place with a history of problems... You know... A negative inference right off the start... Ah... And ah... I did consult legal consultation about ah... Following ahead with that suit. But, I could not find an attorney, given my limited financial ability, and my limited ability to prosecute it myself...

HH Right...

LT It was a thing that was just dropped at that time.

HH Right. How many... How many people live at the apartment complex?

LT Well, let me ask you this... Are you interested in printing the fact and truth, and fairness?

HH I tell you what... I'm gonna... What I'm... I was just asked to do by the... Our weekend reporter, was to try to set something up tomorrow.

LT Mmm Hmm.

HH Are you willing to do that?

LT Well, I give 24 hour caregiving for my 94 1/2 year-old grandmother.

HH Okay.

LT And I have for the last four years and seven months. We have been apart actually less than an average of three minutes a day for four years and seven months. I have arthritis in my hips and my lower spine.

HH Okay.

LT And it is usually after noontime before... Mornings are very difficult for her.

HH (Inaudible)

LT And it takes me a...

HH I tell you what sir, is there a number where we can reach you at tomorrow? Perhaps if in the afternoon you are available, we can set something up, otherwise the reporter who is working can call and get your side of the story.

LT Who... Ah... Ah... I am very interested in being quoted correctly...

HH Ah huh...

LT And accurately.

HH Ah huh...

LT If you want to look up my web page, I am [truthandfairness.com](http://truthandfairness.com).

HH Mmm Hmm. [Truthandfairness.com](http://truthandfairness.com)

LT Dot Com.

HH Is that... Is that uh... Spell it out truth, spell out...

LT It's all together, one word, small letters [truthandfairness.com](http://truthandfairness.com).

[www.truthandfairness.com](http://www.truthandfairness.com). Ah... You know... I guess that has always been my interest, and I ... Channel 6 was not fair... Was very slanderous before.

HH

Right.

LT

Ah... Ah... Ah... I am not interested in being misquoted and ah...

HH

Sir, and I tell you sir, the best way that we can do that is for you to actually go on camera.

LT

Well, I... You know... Probably... You know, I certainly don't mind giving an audio...

HH

Sure.

LT

Thing, and if ah... If especially if I know the questions ahead of time...

HH

Okay.

LT

But ah... I sell a product. It's a thing for a computer. It is a part in a program.

HH

Mmm Hmm.

LT

It does telephone conversation recor... I market it mostly to dads with children who have been involved in divorces that have such a difficult time getting fair and reasonable access to their children, but I also market it to the small business person as ah... Better records, less hassle. To dads, it's better access, less hassle. It's Peace Maker for PC there, and to the small business person it's Record Keeper for PC. Ah... But, I like a copy of the record... I know I do what's

correct and fair by a substantial amount, I just want to be sure that the others I am dealing with deal fairly, and are interested in the same thing... Ah, like I say. I haven't been a party to... I haven't noticed any ah... Well, I haven't noticed... I'm sure Juanita... This is not the first ignorant ruling that Juanita Pavlick has allowed...

LT Is Fred Childers there please?

FV Hold on just a second.

FC This is Fred.

LT Yes, this is Larry Tompkins with Clampitt Apartments. You had called earlier and I am returning your call.

FC Larry, I was wondering if we would be able to get together sometime today?

LT Can you tell me generally the ah... The outline of your request?

Why, I (Inaudible) visit, I don't mind visiting, but I 24-hour caregiver for my 94 1/2 year-old grandmother, and I do that 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and I am in my fourth year and seventh month, and ah... She's p... She has difficulty realizing... Well, when she's at her home here, she doesn't realize it, even though we go to the door and back, time and time again, to look at the numbers on the door, and the homes in the neighborhood and all of that, and ah... She has a difficult time understanding when things are going on... Just... She ah... If she doesn't... You know what I'm saying... If they are very complex though... You know, I have ah... But I don't mind doing a phone interview... You know, to answer any questions or to accept any assistance and donations that you and your company would care

to offer.

FC Donations (Inaudible)...

LT Well, I am just saying the Clampitt's problems, like most people's problems, involve money and cash flow. If your company wants to loan Clampitt \$7,000.00 we could give these residents down there a little longer notice than we have been able to. Do you think you all might be able to spring for \$7,000.00?

FC Mr. Tompkins, your talking to a loathely reporter here, I don't have...

LT Loathely...

FC That much control of time, space, or money.

LT All right. Well, I assume you have some questions. You were probably wanting to ask me some things rather than tell me some things.

FC Yea.

LT I am more than happy to... You know... Answer any relevant and reasonable question. It is just better to ask you over the phone.

FC Sure. Let me ask you, and I'm not (Inaudible) or anything, is an on camera interview out of the question?

LT This... I'm not that public of a person. I don't seek the lime light. I don't shy from it, but I don't see any need for that. Ah... The... What we have here is a very... Well, like I say, I don't see why... Why would a phone interview... Why would an audio interview be sufficient?

FC It probably would be. It's just we are a very visual media, and people like seeing...

LT Well, this is not that major of an event in the scheme of things, so I am thinking a phone interview would be more relevant. Did you talk... Did you talk much with the fella that I talked with last night?

FC Hoit?

LT Yes.

FC Yes, I did.

LT And ah... I am very interested and will demand out of you and your company, that I be treated, and my company be treated very fairly, just like I always do people and businesses... And your company substantially slandered and wrongfully reported two year's ago, making, making a statement... Adel Lewis - Got it on tape.... Adel Lewis said we had been without air conditioning for two months. Now, that was just not correct at all... Zero. So, ya'll slandered... You damaged the company. Your company damaged Clampitt by \$60,000.00 dollars in just the next proceeding months after ya'll abusively and negligently reported that... Ah... Just... Anyway... I'm not interested in being abused. I am not interested in Clampitt being abused by Channel 6 anymore. The crux of the matter, like I told him, is a dollar thing. I gave his some numbers, like an absurd \$400,000.00 claim... Judgment that was granted against Clampitt Apartments in Judge Pavlick's court, on a frivolous lawsuit that a

former employee had whined about not being paid a few hours, and after negligent, abusive Holly Crampton got a hold of it and filed a claim, it was a 15 year claim. Now, you know... The judgment that was rendered was \$400,000.00. The woman claimed that she was held like a slave. Now, we make an announcement on Thursday that we are going to have to close because the sale has fallen through at the last minute, and by the next day ya'll know that. Now, wouldn't you all truly know... Wouldn't you all have even known if somebody was... Is anybody held like a slave in chains like slaves are... You know... Anywhere in this town? Probably in a few places, but ya'll don't dare go there very often, because ho.... But it's pretty remote. Anyway, the point is... The biggest story here is not Clampitt closing, although it is...

FC I think the really big story here is the fact... And maybe not through any fault of your own or through your company...

LT Oh, not even close.

FC But the big story is that in 10 days there's going to be a lot of people not knowing where to go.

LT Oh, you think so? I don't think that's that question at all. I think we only have 14 residents, thanks to negligence and abusiveness. I think all but maybe seven of those now have arrangement, and although that's difficult for seven, I betcha a wealthy station like you all could afford to house those people at the Holiday Inn for the rest of the

month if you really thought it was really that much of a damaging thing. Were following it very closely. We have more interest in those people than ya'll do. You all haven't been back in the last two years to check is the air conditioning working okay... You know what I'm saying...

FC (Inaudible)

LT No, you're trying to make controversy... I believe. I believe that's what your trying to do. Now, are you or are you not?

FC Mr. Tompkins, I shoot straight from the hip.

LT Ah... Well I think your biases are a little goofed up them.

FC I don't think you know (Inaudible)...

LT What other questions...

FC Know my biases are.

LT Well, I can understand that your not accepting... Would a \$400,000.00 claim... Wrongful claim... Abusive claim... Holley Crampton took seven years to get the goofy case to court. She did no requests for production, like I'm going to do when I make a slander suit against you if you don't treat me fairly, and I'm going to have you come sit in front of a camera when I do your non-stenographic videotape deposition about what the facts... What the relevant questions and facts really are in this case.

FC I think that is kind of unfair for you to judge...

LT No, not at all. Based on what evidence I already have...

FC Of me...

LT Based on the evidence that I gave to what's his name yesterday, and I have a documentation of all of this.

FC Your not dealing with Adel Lewis (Inaudible)...

LT No, no... I'm talking about Holt... Hoit.. Holt... I gave him a lot of the details yesterday. Your company, and you and your company ought to have a pretty good clue in on what the most relevant facts are here, and what's the most unfortunate consequences from that. Like I say, I think more is being ah... Ah... Were you the fella that came down to Clampitt this morning?

FC Yes, that was me.

LT Well, now when my employee's tell you that that is a private residence, you... you threatened her. I... I, see, you say... I don't know a lot about you, you threatened her that this wasn't over. Well...

FC No... I, I said no such thing.

LT Oh, nothing close? Well, she's a nurse and she is pretty accurate about what she reports. Yea, there was some kind of a threat... Well, this isn't over, or you'll be back, or whatever... Anyway, that's a private residence...

FC (Inaudible)

LT Down there and...

FC Can I just say something?

LT Yes. I'm very interested.

FC Give me one second...

LT Okay Good.

FC That I will not be stonewalled.

LT Nobod... You're not being stonewalled. I called your station within a very reasonable time yesterday... You know... You moron's reported at 6:00 o'clock that I hadn't responded to a call, and my records indicate that it was just a little before five when that call came to me. Now, do you get a call from a president of... Oh, let me think...

FC (Inaudible) insult from you...

LT Oh... Well, I tell you what... You just ah... I think I have just correctly described... You may take it as an insult, but the facts support it.

FC What if I called you guys a bunch of morons. Well, you wouldn't have the facts to back it up. I do have the facts to back it up. Anybody that goes on city wide TV and say's at 6:00 that a responsible business person, within a little over an hour, has not received a call, is... The implication is...

FC (Inaudible)

LT The implication is that I was nonresponsive, and the guy said a history of problems. The history here is Channel 6 abusively and slanderously reporting... I guess a lot of small businesses... But, you all have done it once to us, we kind of know the pattern. I've got

Holley sued as a Pro Se lawyer, and am somewhat familiar with the rules, and I love truth and fairness, and justice, and don't like being abused. So, anyway, if you want to continue in that vain, what questions do you have?

FC Okay... Well, first of all, like I said, all of this other stuff that your talking about... The lawsuit, the slanderous reporting by Adel Lewis (Inaudible) which could have done your company serious harm... I would like to sort of get away from that, and I think we've talked about (Inaudible)...

LT No, I don't think that's the major issue you all need to cover in this issue, and the subsequent damage, and the...

FC Major issue...

LT And the...

FC (Inaudible) the people that...

LT Do what?

FC Not going to have a home.

LT Do...

FC You don't think that's the major issue?

LT Oh, I think they'll all be taken care of within...

FC (Inaudible)... That's my question... (Inaudible)...

LT Well... Ah... Two, three already know where they are going. A fourth... I think a fourth does. There is actually less than seven, I think, that are not very sure of what their options are. The biggest

story is Clampitt only charged \$700.00 a month, and some may have difficulty trying to ah... Find... They, they won't find anyplace that is cheap. We gave more, did more... Ah... Than any other business that was in service to the elderly. We will put our record up against you or your company's, or anyone's in town.

FC What do you mean by record?

LT Well, you're making an accusation...

FC I'm not making an accusation...

LT That I'm not concerned.

FC I just...

LT Well, when you make a statement...

FC It wasn't a statement, it was a question.

LT Make... No, no... Ah, you... You... Tell me... Ask me again the question.

FC What's going to happen to these people. How are you going to take of them?

LT I... I... Well, ah... We are providing food for as long as we reasonably, financially, legally, and morally... Ah... Can. Ah... Ah... I have already told you, I think there is really less than seven that don't know... Seven or eight, that don't... Have not told us their plans. But, we are monitoring it very closely, very diligently, and will continue to. Ah... But like I say, once again, if your company is that concerned, you all could see about... At your expense, ah... Ah...

FC First of all, that's not our place.

LT Oh, it's not. Oh, I thought your place was to be fair and kind and thoughtful to people, and I thought that would be part of being thoughtful.

FC Secondly, you're talking to a reporter, so... (Inaudible)

LT I'm talking to an agent of Channel 6. Did you know that legally you are an agent?

FC Don't... Don't talk to me about law, okay... I a...

LT I'm just talking to you about the facts.

FC I understand that.

LT Okay. What else do you have? Have I thoroughly answered that question? We are monitoring it closely. I think we are talking about seven or eight people that don't know for sure. So... Ah...

FC So you are monitoring it.

LT Oh sure, you bet.

FC (Inaudible)

LT Very closely. Very closely. Don't misquote me or miss...

FC Nobody is trying to misquote you...

LT I'm just telling you... I'm telling you...

FC (Inaudible)

LT I'm telling you,

FC And I'm asking you...

LT I'm giving you very fair answers, and I'm telling you I will not be

misquoted nor taken out of context. So, be very careful that you write down accurately what I am telling you.

FC This is what I have so far. You tell me if I am misquoting you.

LT No. Oh... Okay.

FC Three out of ten know where they are going.

LT No, no... I think ah... I think seven... I think I simplified it to eight or less do not have firm plans yet.

FC Seven or eight don't know where they are going yet. That's what I have. You guys will provide food as long as you can.

LT Ah... Till we are... Till Friday. Till a week from ah... The day before we gave notice. And once again, we are not charging them any rent for the period after the 1<sup>st</sup>, which we know and we are telling them that we will be open. I feel fairly certain... You know... I've got to... The good old electric company needs to agree to a few more day extension, and I don't know if the good ole gas company would allow for an orderly... A more orderly retreat and extend the gas by a weak. What do you think? Those are the factors that I have to deal with. If the electric... Kind of thing, would agree to a week or so extension... You know, but, once again, the labor is a prob... Well, the food is just, we can't afford to do because of high labor costs.

FC Just to be clear, you did state... You mentioned something about (Inaudible) next Friday.

LT Yea.

FC Is that right?

LT That is correct.

FC (Inaudible)

LT Sure, and then I think... You know, we may have a few more day... We are going to continue to monitor it, and you know... Ah... And ah... You know, it's just Saturday. We... Once we got word of a... Ah... Sale that had fallen through. I'm not sure who broke the contract. The person that was buying it from us, or the bank that had... Even through their board of directors approved it like Tuesday a week ago. It was all go until late Wednesday night, and we... When I was informed by the Realtor that the sale, which I had agreed to, and a very cheap price, to facilitate the ongoing... The smooth ongoing things... You know, I was generous enough and willing enough, and thoughtful enough to have it offered for like one... Like one third of appraised price... Ah... You know, that's giving up \$200,000.00 according to the Appraisal District. Isn't that going pretty extensively, the second, third, and tenth mile.

FC Yeah, I would say that.

LT Well, the deal fell through. Now, who screwed up on that? The bank or the person that was buying it from us?

FC Yeah, and again, so I am clear... I'm new on this story. This sale was...

LT Been pending for a month... Been pending in contract for a month.

FC This actually was to take place between you and someone purchasing your building.

LT That is correct. I had the place for sale. I had contracted with a local Realtor and a month ago, we had it in contract to sell, so that it would continue that it had been, and no one would have to move, even after a 30-day's notice. I would think that would have been a much better deal. But, the deal fell through. Somebody reneged on their contract. I don't know where the fault lies, but I know a major bank officer approved it and checked off on it... Like two to three weeks ago, and all it had to do was go before the board, and it did Tuesday a week ago. So, up until then it was all a go to us.

FC (Inaudible)

LT Ah... I... I don't know that that is relevant at this time. But ah...

FC I would argue with you that it is not relevant... (Inaudible)

LT Well... There... The fact that that there was a sale pending, that we had every reason to believe that it was to have occurred on the afternoon of the 28<sup>th</sup>. Yes, Dear? So, because that...

FC And when did you find out it wasn't going through?

LT Ah... It was late Wednesday night.

FC Which would be the 29<sup>th</sup>...

LT No, the 28<sup>th</sup> was Friday. So the 27<sup>th</sup>... The 26<sup>th</sup>, late, like seven or eight o'clock in the evening, you know... I was informed that the bank had backed out of their contract to fund the deal, and it was not

at any fault of the apartment and the feasibility of it. I think it was some reduced state funding that these people had in another program. I think the cottage drug rehab thing... So, but the... You know, so... Ah... The.... But it was reduced funding. So... You know... Everything was go till boom, right at the last.

FC Ah, so what happens to the building now?

LT Well, it's just up for sale. It ah... You know... It's probably one of the best buys downtown. The price will go up from what I was willing to sell it for.

FC And most likely someone who would buy it...

LT Oh, they would probably do an efficiency apartment thing.

FC (Inaudible)

LT No, too costly (Inaudible). We lost 200,000 in twenty years.

FC (Inaudible) Is this just not a business for someone looking to make money to get into? Hello?

LT I wouldn't think so.

FC Okay. How long have you been in business?

LT Ah... You hear my grandmother calling? She's ah... We...

FC I'm sorry, do you need to...

LT We were... Yeah, I need to take her for a drive... Ah... But I... A thirty minute drive and I can call you back if you have anymore questions.

FC Sure. Actually, I do have a couple of more. Take all the time that you

need.

LT Okay.

FC Because I'll be here.

LT All right.

FC And if I'm not here, like I say, just leave a message.

LT Thank you much.

FC Thank you.

LT Yeah, thank you.

FC Okay.

LT Ah... This is Larry Tompkins. This sounds like Fred Childers.

FC Hold on a second Larry, let me get to my desk.

LT Sure. Okay.

FC Okay Larry. Basically, I just wanted to follow-up and make sure you didn't have anything else...

LT Well, I have good news that we have heard from all but six, that they know where they are going, and ah... You know... Where they will be able to find ah... Substantial and sufficient accommodations... Ah... Some of the six we haven't heard from may know. It's just ah... We... Ah... You know... Haven't seen all of them, but they... Ah... All usually come down for dinner and we will be checking with those we haven't heard from, and ah... You know... So, we have been closely monitoring it, and the number is 6 or less at this point in time. We've got a list and we are writing... You know... Down where... You know... And if people are being able... Ah... Make relocation, and you know... That's our current count. All but 6 we have heard from, so that would mean 6 or less. So, within... You know... And the main thing is ah... We... So, I, I... Did you have any specific questions?

FC Yes, just a couple more just for clarification.

LT Okay.

FC There are only 10 residents at your place at this time?

LT Oh, I think there... There's more than that. I think it's like 14 or 15.

FC Oh... Okay.

LT I think I might have said 14 when I first talked to you, but I asked the person that works with me on the front desk, this afternoon, to do a second count to verify, and I... You know... We know who, where all but six or less... You know... Are going. So... You know... They're... It looks like at a fairly substantial fast rate... You know... Able to find placement.

FC And what about... Mr. Tompkins, what about the possibility of talking with one of the residents about their future, about how they feel about what's going on?

LT Well, for what purpose?

FC Well, In a lot of...

LT What is the focus?

FC Well, in a lot of stories...

LT What is the focus?

FC Well, the focus is the people... The people there.

LT Yeah.

FC On stories, we try to ah... Make a human... Have a human element in there.

LT Yea... Well, is the focus going to be the major and actual cause of

this having to happen?

FC Well, if I get... If I were able to get someone on camera, I would...

LT Ah huh...

FC The focus would turn to them mainly. What they are going to do...

LT Yea.

FC And what's down the road for these people.

LT Well, isn't the major event the fact that they are even having to move in the first place?

FC Sure (Inaudible).

LT Well, why don't you focus on why that's even happening and the focus there is judicial misconduct or ineptness.

FC So, interviewing a resident is not possible?

LT Well... You would have to ah... Have a request from them. If one of them calls you... I'll... You know, they have certain rights and limits. But... You know, you don't have my permission to solicit... You know... Their opinion on an irrelevant issue. They are busy in preparing and moving, and ah... You know... The ah... Ah... The... Moving is not something people do that they usually enjoy. I don't. I don't know... When was the last time you moved?

FC About a year ago.

LT Did you enjoy it.

FC No.

LT It's a lot of work, and you know... Whatever. The point is that this is

happening because an abusive... Ah... Inept or negligent judge allowed an absurd claim to be filed by a lawyer who let the case languish for seven years, did no discovery... None... She called me as her first witness. Now, who wait... Do you... Would you wait seven years to try to preserve evidence of a supposed major damage to an individual. Especially that you had a cont.... Would you do that? You couldn't do that as a responsible, diligent, investigative reporter could you? No. So that's the case... That's the case. Now, you all can either focus up on the major issue, the absurd and shameful fact ah... That this business has been broken by a false, wining claim by a former employee who worked their for five years. Now, who works for five years nowadays, before they quit if they are not satisfied, or their family is not satisfied with working conditions, they quit. They don't make a claim after five years. Holley Crampton didn't even stop there . She made a 15 year claim. She took some grandiose federal law that did not apply, and said that we had bo... Or not we... I was never a stock holder in the corporation, but I was President of the corporation when that place was purchased. So, I am very closely familiar with the numbers and the details at that time, and ah... Ah... But, the claim was that the company was obligated for the full 10 years of the former employer also. Now, you know... does your company warrant anything for 15 years? The paychecks for all employees had stamped on the back endorsement of this and

cashing signified the correct number of hours and the rate of pay worked. Now, how much more specific can you get than that? That is a binding contract, and for five years this woman signed, and all the other employees. Now...

FC What was their claim?

LT Their claim was... She originally whined to the manager that she hadn't been paid for a few hours she worked... For some hours. I had the manager at the time, get with this woman. Her name is Marcela Kirk (SP). You know... I can... I have her sued, I have a currently pending live suit against her and Holley Crampton for malicious prosecution, because they negligently, abusively sued me, also, as a non-stockholder President, and my only liability would have been if I had treated the company as if it were my own to the detriment of the company. There are no facts to support that.

FC (Inaudible).

LT Do what now?

FC You're suing for malicious what now?

LT Prosecution. Malicious prosecution. For having me sued for seven years, do no discovery, have me sit arthritic and fatigued syndrome, from a severe arthritis that hit me about seven years ago, gave their entire side of the case, called me as their first witness, and then rested their case, and then only when I stood up as a Pro Se lawyer and

asked Judge Pavlick to... For assistance in subpoenaing a witness who could testify to what the facts actually were, Holley Crampton jumps up and say's... As if it's an afterthought... "Oh, by the way your honor, my client and I have decided we need to drop two of the three people that we have sued. " In other words, admitting that their case was 66% - 2/3 % inaccurate on the parties that they should have sued in the first place. And, as it turned out, the 10 year claim was substantially wrong because that was a Federal law that applied to corporations that were worth over a million dollars, who did over a million dollars of business. Well, our company... That company didn't do close to that. The book value... The market value... I mean, was not anywhere close to a million dollars. But, she did no discovery in seven years to try to prove that right or wrong, but yet she sued me and she sued my mother, who had protection of a corporation that owned a corporation, who did business as Clampitt Apartments. So, it was just supreme... I won't say supreme... But, substantial negligent and abusiveness on Holley Crampton's part, and Judge Pavlick bought into it, allowed the case to be heard. The motions were made for dismissal because no evidence had been noted... There was... Holley Crampton, in no way, acted as if it were a valid claim, other than filing the suit.

FC What's your opinion on Juanita Pavlick's decision?

LT Oh, well... I think a jury... A blue collar jury decided the case, not

Clampitt's peers... Not Clampitt's peers... Ah... The one person in the jury pool that was even remotely knowledgeable about the business types of things, worked for (Inaudible), and he was dismissed from the jury pool. There was actually a semi-retarded guy that worked at Pick-A-Dilly that was enc.... Allowed on the jury, and this woman was mildly retarded. Now, what a conflict of interest is that? It was absurd. I... Ah... There's just no way that ah... That... Like... The woman, in her own words to the manager... I had the manager at the time, who was in daily... Ah... She was the on-site contact and supervisor of this former employee. She was the one that... That would have... Well, the claim was that she was held like a slave. Well, now, see what I am saying. Do you think 50 very good residents... Ah... You all found about our making announcement and called and acted upon it within a day. Now, how absurd is a claim that a woman, for five years, was held like a slave, and nobody, including her family, new about it. There were no witnesses. It was just the woman, herself testified.

FC (Inaudible)

LT Do what?

FC How old was the woman?

LT Sh... Holley Crampton, after she filed it, took seven years to get a trial date set. Seven years.

FC I'm just wondering about a statute of limitations.

LT For what now?

FC For any claim.

LT Well, it was filed within the statute of limitations, but ever... It doesn't have to be prosecuted until it... I guess there's lack of diligence on the part. But, judges, to a large degree, pander to lawyers. It's just that simple... Seven years. The woman did no discovery. No depositions. I mean, you're wanting to get me on a camera. You know why... Because the visual and audio has a very powerful impact. Well, if I've got somebody that is lying to me, or has damaged someone, or they are a cheat, I want to get that documented. What better way than to put em in front of a camera... Just like I'll be doing with Holley Crampton, I think, about next month, you know... As we get Clampitt winded down, I'm of good enough health, that... Now, I don't know about my grandmother though, she is just very feeble, but... Ah... I plan to, within the next month, take her first, of at least two, non-stenographic videotape depositions, and I am going to be asking her some very relevant questions. Like, why, if she thought she had such a valid claim and such a damaged client, why would she not preserve any evidence, any evidence for seven years? And then just let her... Mu... You know... Babble something. There's... Sh... There's no way that she can... She will either... In the second deposition, I will get her pr.... I'm not that good of a... I guess... Legal and logic expert... Ah... And I'm not a

practiced attorney, so I don't know the devious, you know... All the... It's amazing the theft that goes on regularly at the courthouse. But... Ah... All I got to do is study the... Either lies or ineptness that she will answer on the first set of questions, and then I'll study those and find out the questions that... In her own words, she will obviously prove herself a liar or inept. She... She...

FC (Inaudible)...

LT Do what now?

FC (Inaudible)

LT Well... Well, good Judge Nelson, I will just ask to sanction her... I mean, Judge Kendall took the rare opportunity... Now, a lot of this I am saying specifics about the case are off the record because I've got a pending lawsuit. Now, do we have an agreement on that?

FC (Inaudible).

LT I want you to know the validity of my claim, because it is valid and if she doesn't... She's got to show up for it. I'm a Pro Se lawyer. If she doesn't show up for it, then basically I ask for a continuance motion. I state the reason... I mean the Texas Rules of Court are open for you and me to. And they really have some good phrases and words in them. But, the individual has to be healthy enough, and at least some money to get them effective.

FC Mr. Tompkins, is it okay to report that you plan to sue the lawyer.

LT Oh, I have a... I have an active lawsuit against the former employee

and the lawyer.

FC Okay.

LT I have been to two hearings and I have been granted the motions for continuance that I have asked for. Ah... Judge Kendall wrote an 18 page... Do you remember hearing about Holley Crampton getting fined in Judge Kendall's court?

FC Vaguely.

LT \$46,000.00. He wrote an 18 page... I have it on file in my suit against Crampton, where a Federal Judge is saying that she was negligent and abusive in the tune of \$46,000.00 to General Motors. So, it's not just me saying she's abusive. It is a Federal Judge who took the time, effort, and energy to write an 18 page memorandum opinion. Now, that's a lot. So, he was aggravated at her. He felt he had substantial justification, and he wanted it down in writing. I think that part of her, she appealed it, and part of that... Ah... Was reversed by an appeal (Inaudible)... But, she was still fined \$25,000.00, and I... It's highly unusual. So, it's a Federal Judge saying the same thing I am saying, and that's one of the rulings I'll have to say Judge Kendall did well on. But, anyway... Ah... The... That's the tragedy. That's the tragedy that a Texas American business invested \$250,000.00 dollars, worked 20 years, served three meals a day to an average of 40-50 residents, sheltered them, and protection. We added an on-sight policeman there who lived in an apartment...

Ah... For... Nobody in town is at a better price. We ah... We did not get on the government subsidy. But, worked 20 years, provided that for all those people, and because of Judge Pavlick and an abusive lawyer and a false claim... Ah... You know... Those two... Those two made it happen and allowed it to happen. Pavlick should have... She was asked to reduce the settlement afterwards. She should have at least done that. She shouldn't have allowed the case to have been heard in the first place. I mean, my gosh, it's just pitiful. It's pitiful. Seven years and no discovery. That's Prima Fascia evidence that she didn't think it was a very valid claim. Certainly not a \$400,000.00 claim. They gave the woman more than the market value of the company.

FC Mr. Tompkins, is that... Was the \$400,000.00 claim what break... What broke you? Is that what got you to the point to where you needed to sell our building?

LT That got us to where we were vulnerable, when your company, Channel 6 (Inaudible) two year's ago, and the year... And I'm not saying you've got to include that. I know your not gonna... The bigger issue is Clampitt was substantially weakened to where maintenance was not as good as... You know what I'm saying. There was a decline in maintenance. However, Clampitt was never without an air conditioning for two months, as Adel Lewis testified and reported. That Clampitt was without air conditioning for two months.

How absurd. We had cool air all over the building the whole time. There's like... What is there... Four air conditioning units in the building. We were having difficulty with one. But, it was a common air return. But, anyway, it just... The major first thing was this wrongful suit, wrongful claim, by an employee who had worked there for five years, and then the claim... The wine was enhanced to a 15 year claim... To disprove... I'll tell you, this is what happened. To disprove the 10 years on this federal law that applied to corporations over a million dollars... You see, Crampton didn't do her homework on that, and she didn't find out what the corporation was... She should have done that in a deposition or something soon after the suit was filed. The ah... What was I saying? Help me with my focus there.

FC Oh... Ah... Well we were on the maintenance of the building went down in response to I guess being sued and ah...

LT Well, they... They pulled... They pulled out \$60,000.00 in two years. \$60,000.00 went to that wrongful judgment instead of going to maybe make painted walls fresher, or things like that. Even though Clampitt was a very... I... The bu... Like I say... Where is the justice in giving a woman \$400,000.00 when the company has rightfully and fairly, and hon... Very honestly, provided meals three times a day. We've got some residents that have been a resident there the entire time that we have had it. Now, that's not... These are good

Christian ladies. That's a sign of a very satisfied customer, and a good product at a good price... At a very good price, and... You know... Just any small business that employs labor has a tremendous burden of rules... Federal / State rules. If this woman had had a claim... A valid claim, she could have gone to the Labor Department. They would have investigated a valid claim, and she would have had to have pain a lawyer nothing. I mean she would have had to pay the Labor Department nothing.

FC Mr. Tompkins, I'm sorry to cut you short. I have to go.

LT Well, I tell you what, the primary focus here is judicial misconduct or ineptness and abusive lawyering has forced a very, very, honest retirement apartment to have to close their doors.

FC Okay. I have your words right here.

LT Ah... Now... Ah... Right off the bat, the guy was negative last night... A said, a place, a business with a history of... Ah... What was it... A history of problems... You know... Based on... That was a negative, slanderous remark, and the fact that they said that ah... I hadn't returned a phone call. He didn't call me until about an hour before the report, and I think that's not really... So... So he implied something that wasn't true. Now, I hope the facts are going to be more correct this time.

FC I will do that.

LT Ah...

FC They will certainly be there.

LT When do you expect to air something on this?

FC Ah... Probably, well tonight at 10 or tomorrow at 10. We only have a 10:00.

LT Talking about 10 o'clock at night?

FC Uh huh.

LT Okay... Ten... You all don't have a 6 o'clock on Saturday or Sunday. So, it will either be at 10 o'clock tonight or 10 o'clock tomorrow night.

FC Right.

LT Well, very good. Well, if I may assist you in any way, I think the good news on this deal is there are 6 or less... Ah... That have to... Ah... Ah... Ah... That we don't know for certain have made arrangements, but it's shameful and pitiful that the company that has worked so hard for so many years... Ah... Ah... Along with these residents, are the losers of judicial misconduct or ineptness and abusive lawyers.
